



All permanent makeup procedures are multi-session processes. You are required to come back for at least one touch-up visit before it can be determined that your work is complete. Touch-up visits are scheduled at four-six week intervals (30-45 days).

Be prepared for the color intensity of your procedure to be significantly sharper, brighter, or darker than what is expected for the final outcome. It will take time for this transition based up how quickly the outer layer of your skin exfoliates. (roughly 30 day process)

While these colors may initially simulate the exact color and tone desired, they will not always remain a perfect match as your own skin color will vary depending on exposure to cold, heat, sun, and circulatory changes. For example, if you tan your skin and had a scar camouflaged, your surrounding skin will be darker in appearance than the treated area.

Please review and initial the following:

_____ 1. Since delicate skin or sensitive areas may swell slightly or redden, some clients feel it is best not to make any social plans for a day or two following any procedure. It is always best to avoid these procedures within days prior to important life events such as weddings. Procedures may take longer than expected to complete under some circumstances. If you plan on consuming alcohol, limit to 8-12oz/day for the first 48 hours.

_____ 2. Wear & bring your normal lip color or brow pencils to the office day of the procedure.

_____ 3. Eyebrows will be cleaned up pre-procedure. Please do not tweeze/wax/thread prior to your appointment. If you do, it should be more than 48 hours before. Electrolysis should be done no less than five days, before. Do not assume any method of hair removal for at least two weeks after the procedure. Any eyelash or eyebrow tinting or eyelash curling should be done no sooner than 48 hours before or two weeks after the procedure.

_____ 4. Refrain from the use of alcohol, aspirin, aspirin-containing medications, ibuprofen, or other blood thinning medications for seven days before and two days after any procedure. Refrain from any judgement altering drugs for at least 24 hours prior to any procedure. No medication should ever be discontinued without first consulting your physician.

_____ 5. A skin test is offered upon request up to 48 hours prior to the procedure.

_____ 6. Have a solid meal pre-procedure and no coffee.
